During the summer months our U17 Team will be heading to France for the Paris World Games, we have training camps for our Regional Academy Players, a new member of staff has joined our team and we are on the cusp of launching our new website, in partnership with Uprise VSI. Our online Membership system will take effect as the 18/19 season gets underway which will bring a whole new user experience for our Members. It is certainly exciting times ahead for Badminton Wales and I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your continued support as we develop to make strides in all areas of Badminton in Wales. ### **Performance Update**

As the season 2017/18 draws to a close, it has been an incredibly positive season with numerous players excelling within their age group competitions in England/Wales. The Regional Academy Coaching Team are extremely pleased with the commitment and efforts players have applied throughout the season and are looking forward to working with them during the summer months, in preparation for an expansive and revised tournament schedule for next season.

Badminton Wales are committed to the ongoing development of it's players within the training and competition environment. We will be building on "Coach Support" at events for next season, having piloted it this season with selected Badminton England events. It has proven to be a welcomed addition in supporting our Regional Academy players.

The U15 Quadrangular, held in May, was an excellent event hosted by Badminton Wales at Sport Wales National Centre. As ever it was an action packed 3 days with all of our players giving a huge amount of effort in the team event, narrowly loosing to Scotland 5-4, Ireland 7-3 and the eventual winners England 8-1. Having fought hard for their country in the team event the players were faced with the individual event, which they all gave great performances and have taken many positives away with them from the event.

In the senior ranks, National Women's Champion Jordan Hart, ended the season with a flurry of excellent performances. She reached the later stages of three of her last four tournaments, with an outstanding performance at the Lithuanian International, narrowly losing out to Kristin Kuuba of Estonia in the final. Jordan will build on her success and take what has been a positive year forward, to establishing herself firmly within the top 100 next season. Jordan ended the year with a World Ranking of 117 and season career high of 114.

Structurally the Performance Pathway is now taking considerable shape at Satellite Level, with 3 Satellite Centres (Cardiff & Vale, West Glamorgan, Carmarthenshire) recently qualifying for Community Chest financial support. Badminton Wales are supporting and guiding all Satellite Centres through these early stages. Our first objective is to upskill Satellite Centre Coaches onto the BWF Coach Education Pathway, this will provide all our coaches with up-to-date qualifications and

## **Development Update**

Our Shuttle Time initiative is now in full swing across Wales. We are currently delivering courses for teachers, leaders, coaches, leisure centre staff and local authority staff. The response to the initiative has been overwhelming with it now being delivered across 16 local authorities. We are working with Gwynedd local authority, Freedom Leisure in Powys and GLL in Cardiff to deliver the initiative to enable the leisure centres to set up Shuttle Time sessions as an exit route for the sessions that are being delivered in the schools. To date we have delivered 22 Shuttle Time courses, trained 276 teachers, and engaged with 2753 children through competitions and festivals.

#### Junior League

Our junior leagues across Wales are going from strength to strength with more opportunities for our young players to play competitively This year sees the introduction of the first National Junior League Finals which will be held in Brecon Leisure Centre on the 22 July 2018 for the winners of all the local junior leagues across Wales. The vision is for the National Junior League Finals to be hosted in different venues each year to make it accessible for all the junior leagues.

#### **Partnership Work**

We are pleased to be working with Game on Wales who are heavily involved in delivering opportunities to Coalfield Communities across Wales. In partnership with them we will work within these communities to offer our Shuttle Time initiative, giving the children access to new skills and opportunities whilst upskilling the key people within the communities to deliver the initiative.
